This is why in previous attempts at recovery I never grasped any depth of understanding of this step and then in turn did not reap the benefits.

This time I went to my sponsor and asked him to explain it to me. After instructing me to read step two in the Na basic text he said we will meet and talk about it. After having dinner together and talking about recovery amongst other subjects he asked me a question, "Do you think that you and I talking right now is stronger than you on your own?" I replied "yes" and he stated that that is an example of a power greater than yourself. He made sure to reiterate that my higher power cannot be solely my sponsor. Because my sponsor could relapse or die or any number of things. But just as him and I speaking is a power Greater than myself so are many other things. Such as two addicts speaking in a meeting or an NA meeting as a whole.


